Statement from the Base Commander



Dear Base Members,

Speaking of old fellers, Bud Warren was recognized for his achievement of being qualified for a grand total of 76 years. He was awarded a certificate by the National Commander.

At the last meeting of 2023, we voted for the Hall of Fame boat. Last year we Inducted the L. Mendel Rivers (SSN-686). Every year since 1999, we have inducted the Hall of Fame boat and placed a shadowbox for them in the quarterdeck of the Submarine Learning Facility. The existing shadowbox is then placed in the auditorium. Along with that ceremony, we honor those who departed on eternal patrol on board the USS Shark II, in WWII. We toll each member of the Shark II, at the Shark II Memorial, right in front of the Submarine Learning Facility. This honor is a commitment to the Submarine Veterans of WWII when they disbanded. We also presented a wreath to be taken to sea by the USS New Mexico in honor of all the submarine veterans who lost their lives in WWII.

We were there for the Change of Command for the USS Washington and witnessed the awarding of the Presidential Unit Citation. The Hall of Fame Boat program is a Submarine Recognition Program that serves the submarine community by recognizing one Submarine of exceptional merit each year. The HoF Program and those submarines nominated are wholly conceived, voted upon, and approved, by members of the Hampton Roads Base of the USSVI.org. Formal recognition of the successful candidate boat is provided by the Submarine Learning Facility in Norfolk VA.

1999 - USS NORFOLK (SSN714) First Navy Ship to have all Tomahawks land on target.

2017 - USS Requinn (SS/SSR481) Radar Pickett Operations in North Atlantic
